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# Interaction Report Assistant

## User's Guide

### Abstract

Interaction Report Assistant is a reporting tool that allows you to create a special report that you design. You choose the data and the layout, and generate a customized report that uses your specifications. You can edit and update the queries you create, and print or export the output for distribution, and save the queries to use again. If you need to quickly generate a business report with a customized layout, Interaction Report Assistant is the tool for you to use.

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# Introduction

Interaction Report Assistant is a reporting tool that allows you to create a special report that you design. You choose the data and the layout, and generate a customized report that uses your specifications. You can edit and update the wizard selections for the reports you create, and print or export the output for distribution. This easy-to-use reporting tool contains *packages* of data for you to choose from. You simply select the *layout* for your report and Interaction Report Assistant guides you through your selection options to create the special report you need. You can also save your report queries to use again.

The information in this guide is for business managers and users responsible for generating and managing reports. Users might also include partners, planners, installers, administrators, and end users who plan to install and configure Interaction Report Assistant, or use this tool to generate special-purpose business reports.

# Overview

Interaction Report Assistant leads you in designing a special report for your specific needs. After selecting a data package to base your report on, it allows you to select the best way to display your data—either a Table or Matrix layout. Next, based on the available fields in the data package, you select the columns or rows to display the data in your custom report. After selecting the Users or Sites and Workgroups to include in your report, you are assisted in choosing the Filters, Date and Time, for sorting your data. You can also choose how to group the information in your report. Interaction Report Assistant allows you to review your selections before generating your report, and it saves your selections for easy editing, until you export your final results to an Excel, PDF or a Word file. You can also save your Report Assistant queries to use again.

## Data packages

Interaction Report Assistant has from 9 to 12 predefined data packages. Each package contains a set of fields to display the data in your report. Select one package to base your report on.

Be aware that some packages will not return data if your system is not tracking the data related to the package, for example, media types or skills. The descriptions of the packages also appear in Interaction Report Assistant when you select an available package in the Data box. For more information on data packages, see [Appendix A](#).

Package	Description
Agent Status	Contains records of Agent state changes. State changes are based on login and logouts, status, and ACD login and logouts.
Agent Queue Statistics	Contains interval-based interaction statistics associated with the User Queue. Use this package if you want to report on interval-based summaries.
Agent Queue Statistics (Media Type)	Contains media type and interval-based interaction statistics associated with the User Queue. Use this package if your system is tracking media types.
Agent Queue Statistics (Custom Groups)	Contains interval-based interaction statistics by Custom report groups associated with the User Queue. Use this package if your system is using Custom Groups or DNIS for reporting.
Workgroup Queue Statistics	Contains interval-based interaction statistics associated with ACD and non-ACD workgroups Queues. Intervals are defined as the period in which your statistics are logged to the database. The system default is 30 minutes.
Workgroup Queue Statistics (Custom Groups)	Contains interval-based interaction statistics associated with ACD and non-ACD workgroups Queues. Intervals are defined as the period in which your statistics are logged to the database. The system default is 30 minutes. Use this package if you want to report on Custom groups defined in your system. Use this package to report on interval-based summaries.
Workgroup Queue Statistics (Media Type)	Contains interval-based interaction statistics associated with ACD and non-ACD workgroups Queues by Media Type (if any). Use this package if your system is tracking media types.
Workgroup Queue Statistics (Skills)	Contains interval-based interaction statistics associated with ACD and non-ACD workgroups Queues by Skills. Use this package if your system is tracking skills.
Interactions (Tracker)	Contains information related to the interaction and its participants.
Scoring (Recorder)	Contains information related to scoring a recording such as name of the scored individual, name of individual scoring the recording, total score of recording, recording information, and so on.
Voicemails (Tracker)	Contains information about voicemails left by Interaction Tracker contacts. Note: This package requires the I3_ACCESS_TRACKER license for the package to be displayed in the list of Available Packages.
Interaction Detail	Contains data related to all physical interactions placed or received by the system.
Interaction Feedback Survey Scoring Detail	Contains information related to a survey score such as survey name, survey score, name of agent whose interaction had the survey attached, customer contact name (if available from Interaction Tracker), question name and question score, and so on.
Interaction Feedback Survey Utilization	Contains records of survey states, for example, Completed and Opted-Out.

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## Wrap-up codes data

The Crystal Historical wrap-up reports and many of the available Interaction Report Assistant fields exist for legacy purposes. These reports can be used to report on migrated legacy 3.0 data, but cannot be used for 4.0 data. Interaction Reporter Legacy Crystal Historical wrap-up codes reports and the Report Assistant wrap-up codes reports are used to report on 3.0 wrap-up data migrated from pre-4.0 environments only. Any wrap-up data generated in 4.0, or later, should be accessed using the Interaction Reporter Wrap Up Codes reports.

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## RDL Specification

Generated reports adhere to the Report Definition Language (RDL) specification which is a common schema that allows interchange of report definitions.



# Installation

Interaction Report Assistant is a licensed Interaction Supervisor feature. It is available in an IC Business Manager Workspace View.

## Planning

When planning for Interaction Report Assistant, you need to consider software applications and licensing.

## Hardware and Software prerequisites

The hardware and software prerequisites for Interaction Report Assistant are the same as for all CIC Workstation Applications. See the *PureConnect Installation and Configuration Guide* for details.

### Note:

Microsoft .NET Framework is required on all workstations running ICBusiness Manager. The .NET Framework requirements are stated in the Client/Admin Workstation section of the CIC Software Requirements page at:

Viewing an exported report, generated by Interaction Report Assistant, requires Microsoft® Excel® or Adobe Acrobat Reader®.

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## Licensing prerequisites

Interaction Report Assistant functionality is controlled by licensing. It requires an Interaction Report Assistant Supervisor Plug-In add-on license, which displays the Reporting page with the Report Assistant icon in IC Business Manager.

The actual name of the license that appears in the License Management dialog is I3\_ACCESS\_REPORT\_ASSISTANT\_SUPERVISOR\_PLUGIN.

The Voicemails (Tracker) Report Assistant package requires the I3\_ACCESS\_TRACKER license for the package to be displayed in the list of Available Packages.

The Activation File Management tool allows you to manage and configure your PureConnect product licenses. You can access the tool on the My Support Dashboard at <https://genesyspartner.force.com/customercare/GenesysCommunityLogin>. You must have the appropriate credentials to access this portal.

You can view your license history from the License Web pages on the PureConnect Customer Care website. 
## Installing

Interaction Report Assistant is installed on administrator and manager client workstations using the **IC Business Manager Applications** workstation install from the PureConnect Customer Interaction Center (CIC) .iso file, available from the PureConnect Product Information site at <https://my.inin.com/products/Pages/Downloads.aspx>. The install creates IC Business Manager shortcuts in the PureConnect folder of the **Start** Menu and on the Windows desktop.

## Verifying the data source

During CIC installation a data source, **IC Report Logs**, is created during the database installation process in Setup Assistant. Interaction Report Assistant depends on this data source configured in Interaction Administrator **IC Data Sources** container.

Interaction Report Assistant connects to the database specified in IC Report Logs. It is a requirement that this data source exists for Interaction Report Assistant.

# Creating Reports

Reports are easily created using the Interaction Report Assistant wizard.



New Interaction Report Assistant

We encourage you to experiment with designing different layouts to display your company's data in the best format for your analysis and reporting needs. Here are some guidelines for using Interaction Report Assistant.

## Starting Interaction Report Assistant

The **New Interaction Report Assistant** wizard is available in an IC Business Manager Workspace View. To access **New Interaction Report Assistant** wizard:

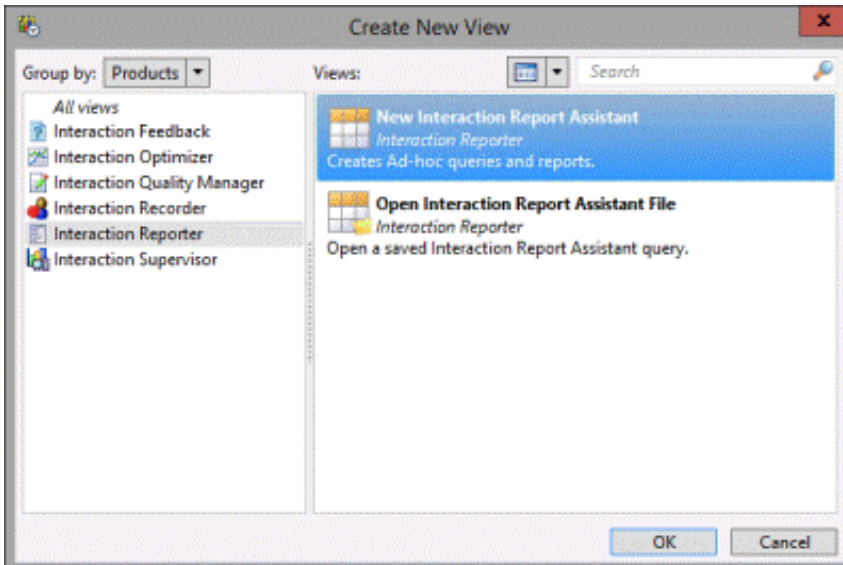
1. In IC Business Manager, click the **Default Workspace** module tab.



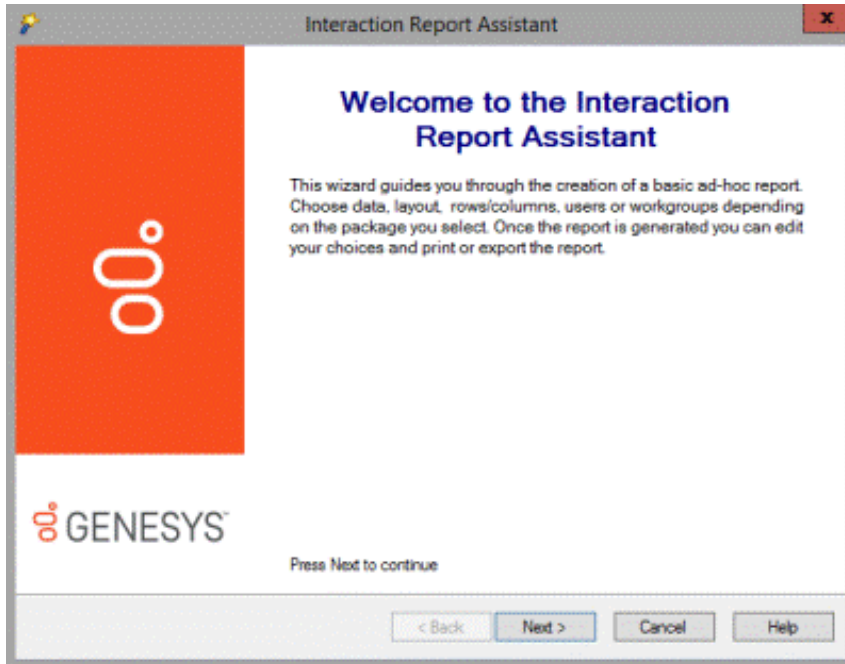
2. On the IC Business Manager toolbar, click **New**.



The **Create New View** window is displayed.



3. In the **Group by** drop-down, select **Products**, and in the left pane select **Interaction Reporter**.
  4. In the right pane, select **New Interaction Report Assistant**, and click **OK**.
- The Interaction Report Assistant wizard is started.



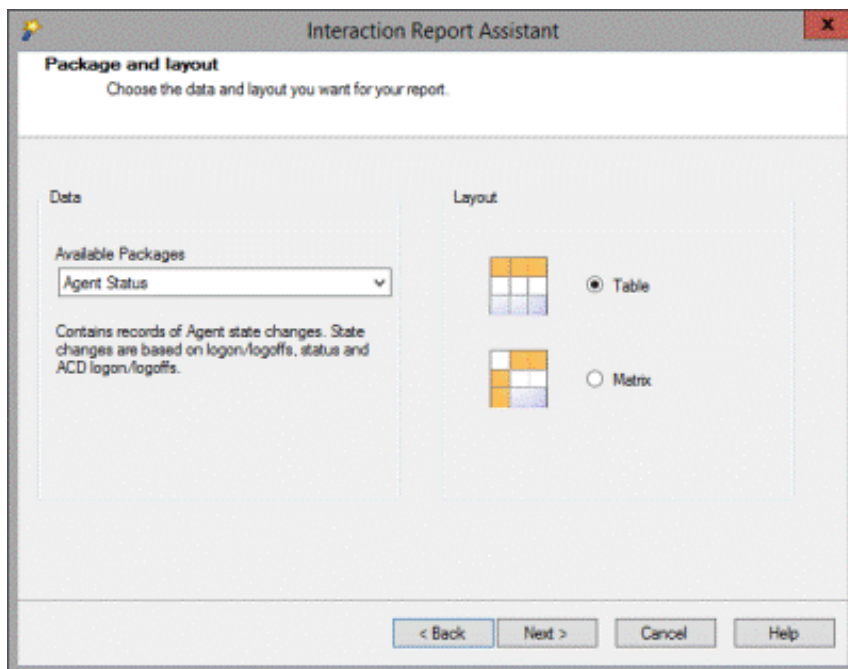
To use the wizard to guide you through creating a basic report, click **Next**.

## Creating Queries and Reports

Here's how to use Interaction Report Assistant to create queries and reports.

On the **Welcome to the Interaction Report Assistant** screen, click **Next**.

The **Package and layout** dialog is displayed.



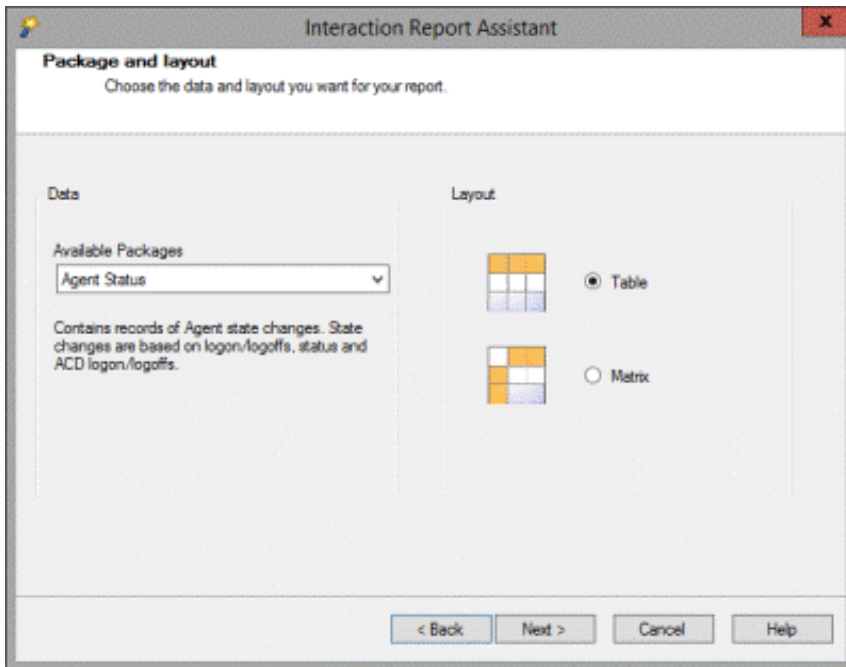
In the next section, you'll begin designing the report by selecting a package and layout.

## Designing a report

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## Selecting a data package and layout

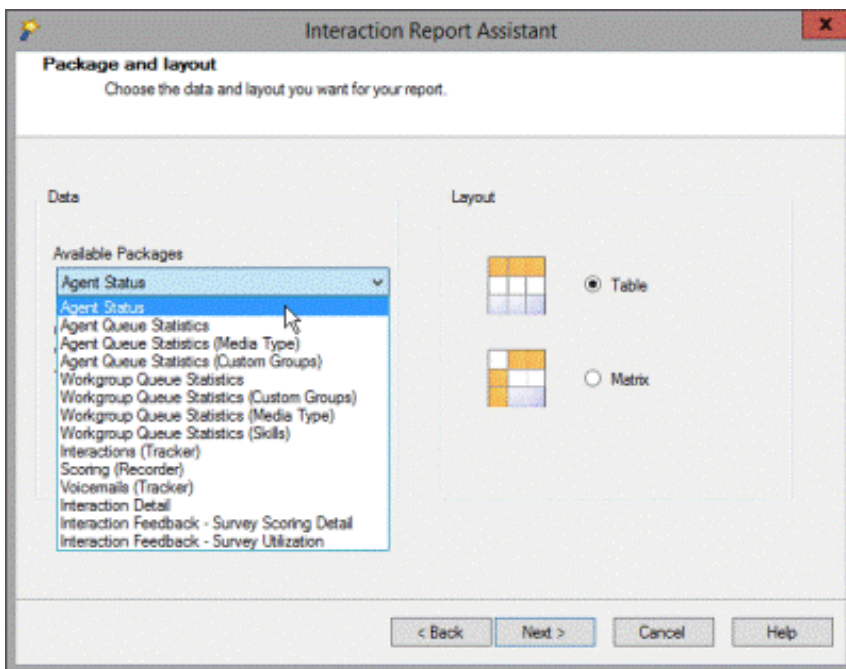
Interaction Report Assistant wizard guides you through designing and generating your specialized report.



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## Choosing a data package

When you design your report, first select the package that contains the **Data** records you want to base your report on, and then select the report **Layout**—**Table** or **Matrix**.



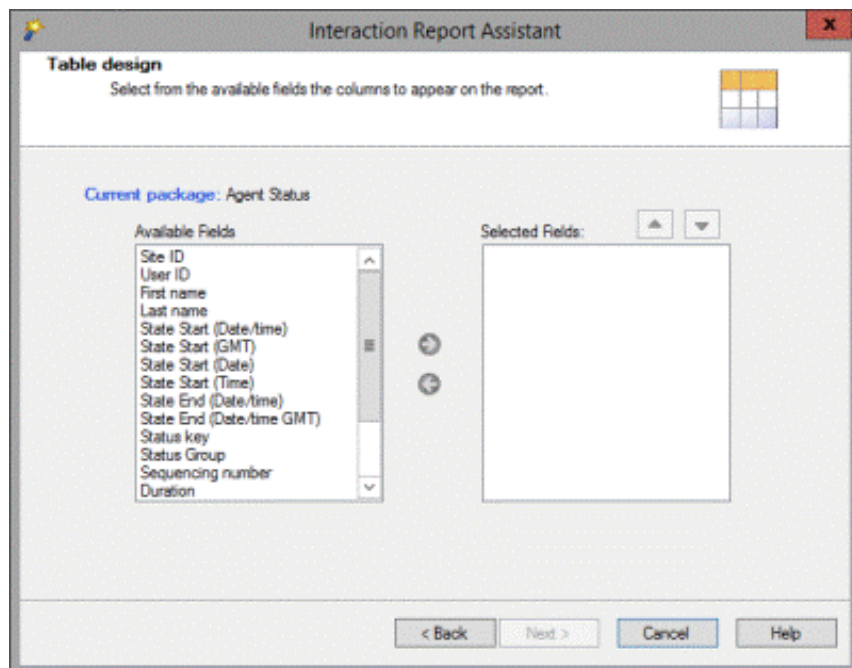
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## Choosing report fields

Next, based on the available fields for the package selected, add the columns or rows to display the data in your custom report.

## Table layout

For Table layout, select fields for columns that will appear in your report.



### Note:

The fields displayed in the Available Fields list box are *friendly* names and not the actual database name.

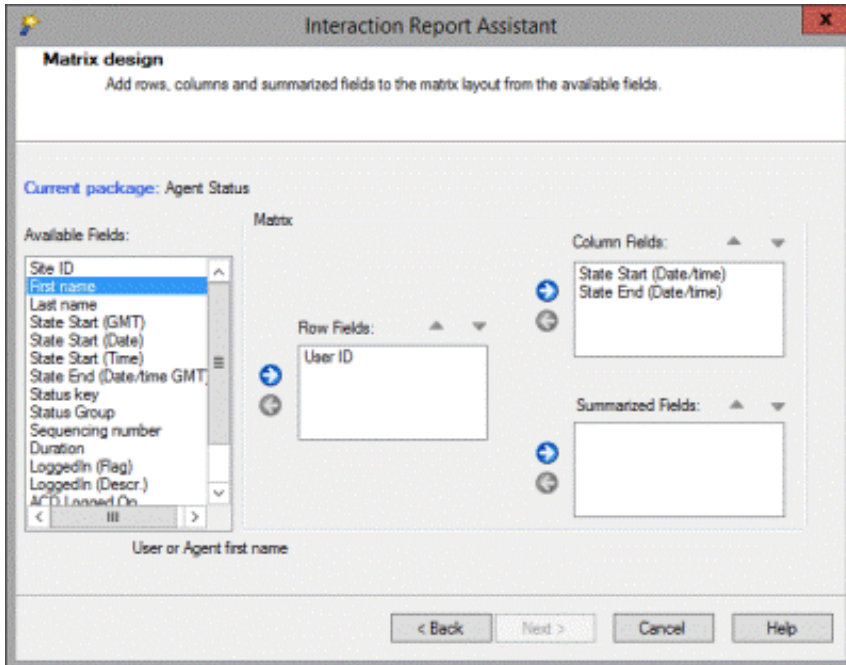
## Table Summary fields

You can summarize fields in Table reports. For more information, see [Grouping data](#).



## Matrix design

For Matrix layout, select fields for columns and rows that will appear in your report.



### Note:

Matrix reports have Summarized Fields that should contain fields with numeric values. If the Field listed in the Summarized Fields list does not contain numeric values, the field will be counted rather than summarized. For example, if Interaction Type is included in the Summarized Fields list, the report will not show Interaction Types such as call, chat, or e-mails, but rather the total number of Interaction Types found in the database.

The summarized fields in the Matrix layout does not summarize at the same level of detail as using the Summary Type under grouping data in the Table Layout. For more information on Table layout summary, see [Grouping data](#).

## Selecting Users

After designing your report layout, you will select users for which to run your report on. Select users from a workgroup or select specific users.


## Selecting Users in a Workgroup

If your package is based on User data, the following dialog is displayed. Select users in a workgroup by choosing a **Site ID** and **Workgroup** from the drop-down boxes, and clicking **Add** to display the users in the **Selected Users** list box.

**Note:**

If you are running a single-site configuration, the **Site ID** field is not displayed.

If you want multiple users from a workgroup but not all users, it might be easier to add a workgroup and individually remove the users you do not want to report on.



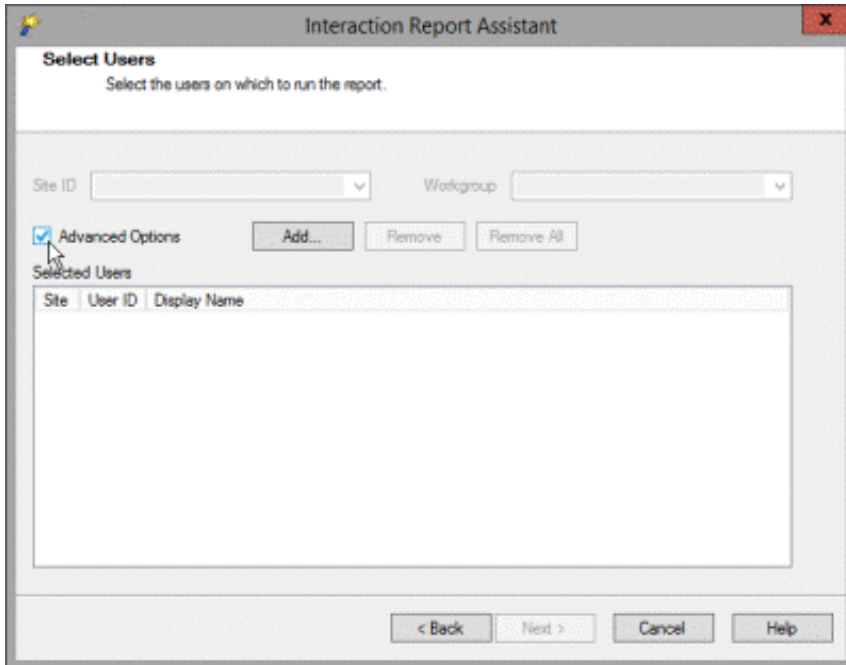

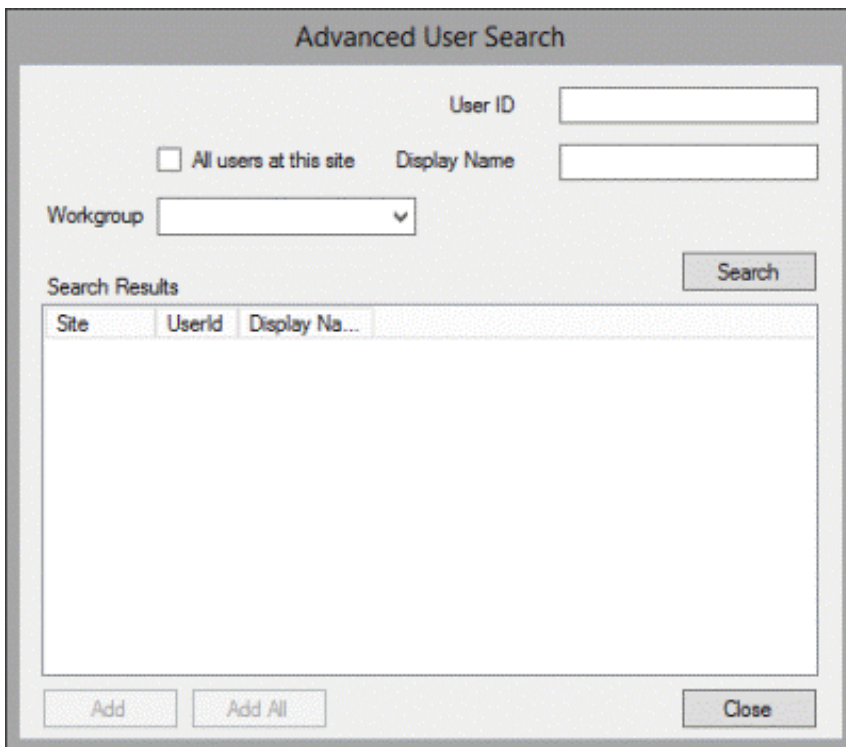


## Selecting specific users

If a user is not in a workgroup, you can select **Advanced Options** to search by User ID or by name.



After selecting Advanced Options, click Add. The Advanced User Search dialog is displayed.



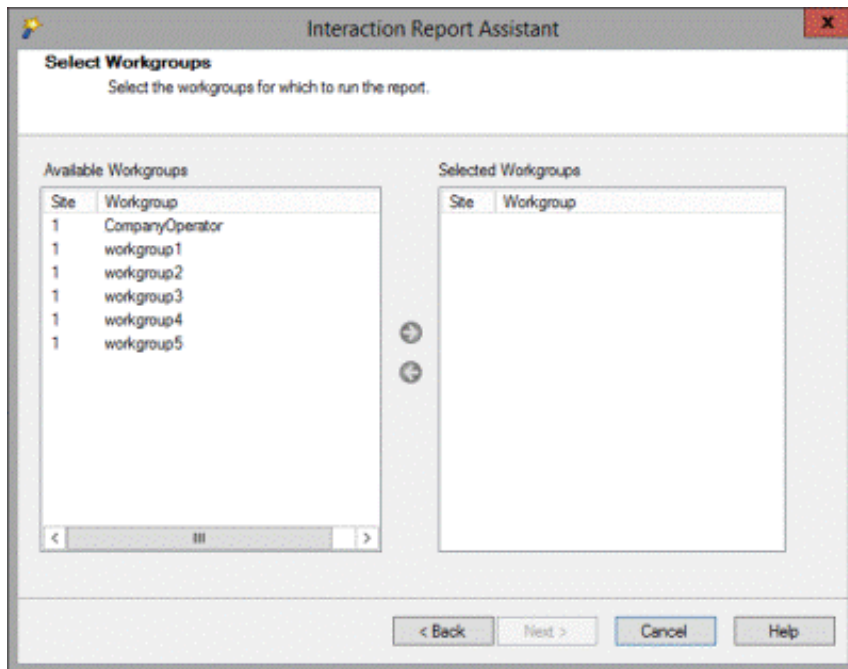
Use any of the fields to search for a specific user. You can search for a user by Workgroup, User ID, or by name. You can use one or more fields to refine your search. Click **Search** to display your results. Select the users to include in your report and click **Add**, or click **Add All**.

Use the Advanced User Search dialog repeatedly to create a list of all the Users to include in your report. For example, you can select all users from a workgroup, remove some of the users from the list, and then add another workgroup to the list. Continue adding and removing users to the list without closing the dialog.

## Selecting Workgroups

If the package you selected includes data from multiple sites, the following dialog is displayed. Use this dialog to select one or more workgroups from specific sites.



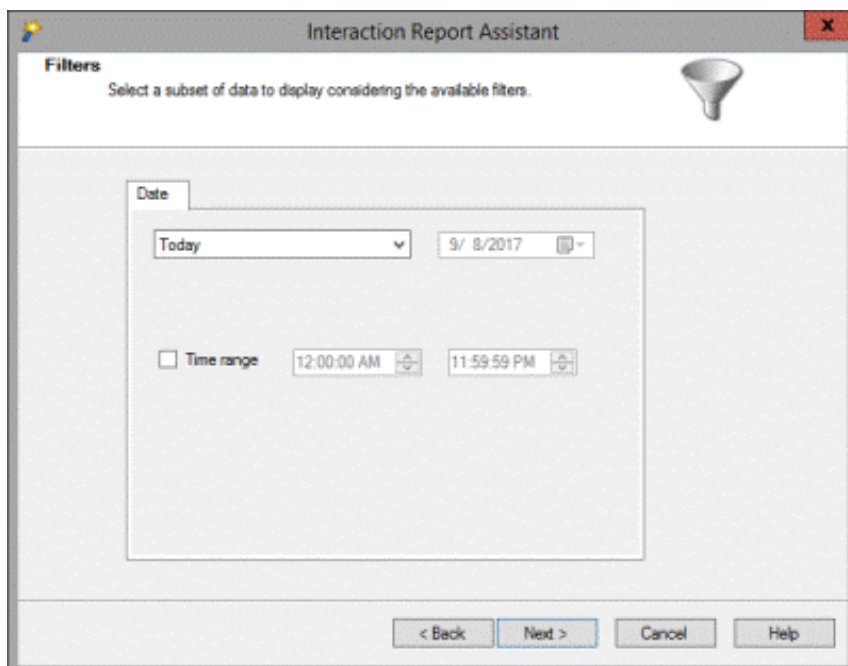
As an example, you can create a report to compare performance across sites. To do this, you must know the numeric Site ID of the servers you are including in the report.

Click on the column headings to sort by **Site ID** or **Workgroup**.

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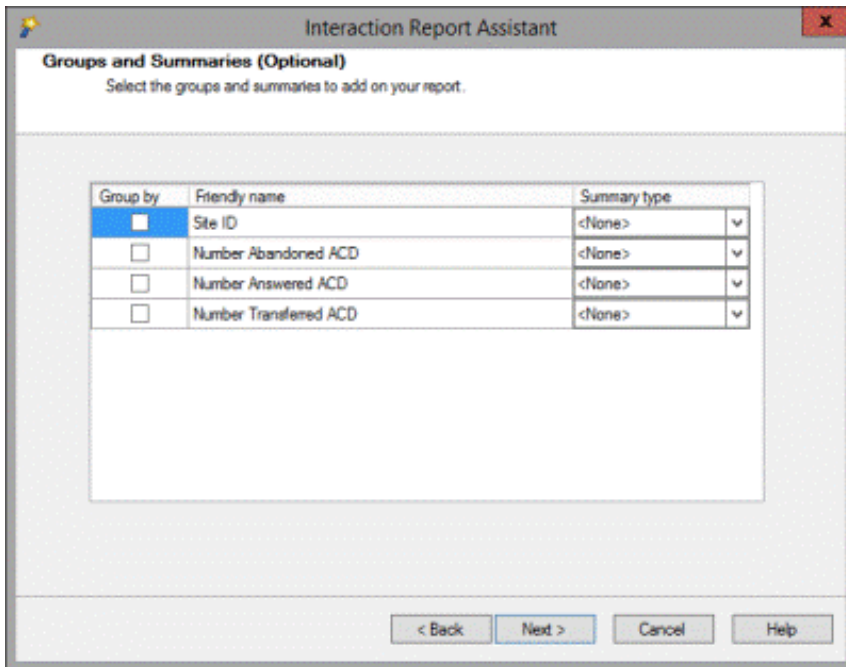
## Filtering your data

Use the Filters dialog to refine the data to display in your report. First, select a filter from the **Available Filters** box. Select the data to be displayed in your report from the options displayed for the filter you have chosen.



## Grouping data

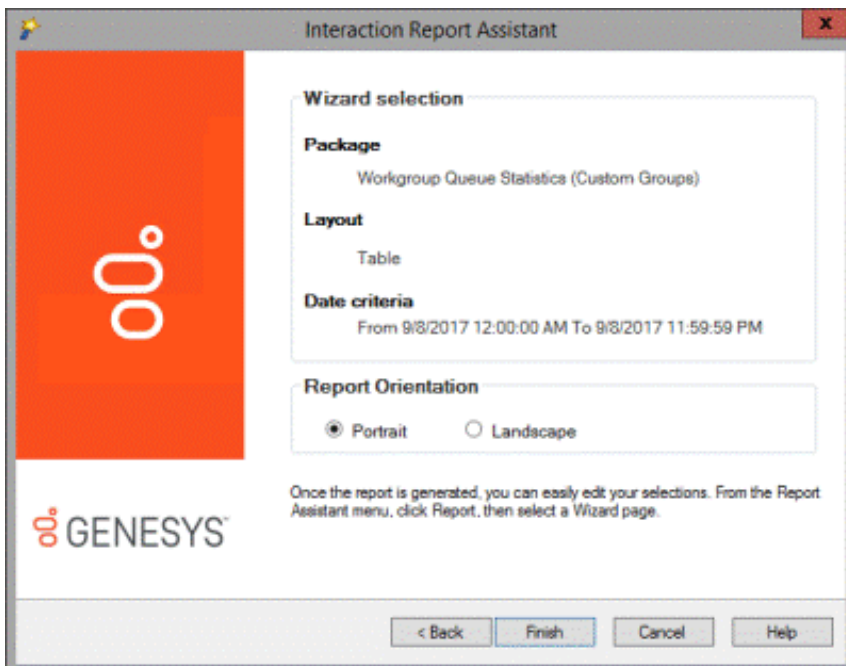
For a Table layout report, you can choose to group the information.



When you select a **Group by** box, the report will be sorted by the **Friendly Name** field. If the field is numeric, you can summarize the data by **Average**, **Count**, or **Sum** using the **Summary Type** drop-down box.

## Confirming your choices

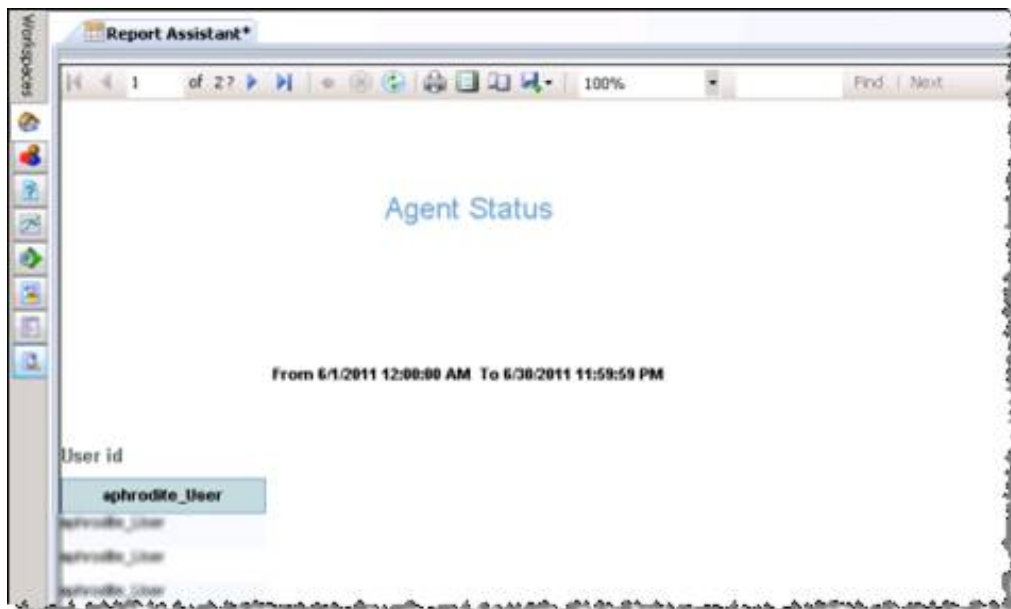
The **Wizard** selection dialog displays the selections you made for the **Package**, **Layout**, and **Date criteria** for your report.



In the **Report Orientation** box you can change the format of the generated report. Click **Back** to change any of your selections. This orientation will be the one kept when you export your report.

## Generating the report

When you click Finish, the generated report is displayed in the Workspace.



## Print Layout

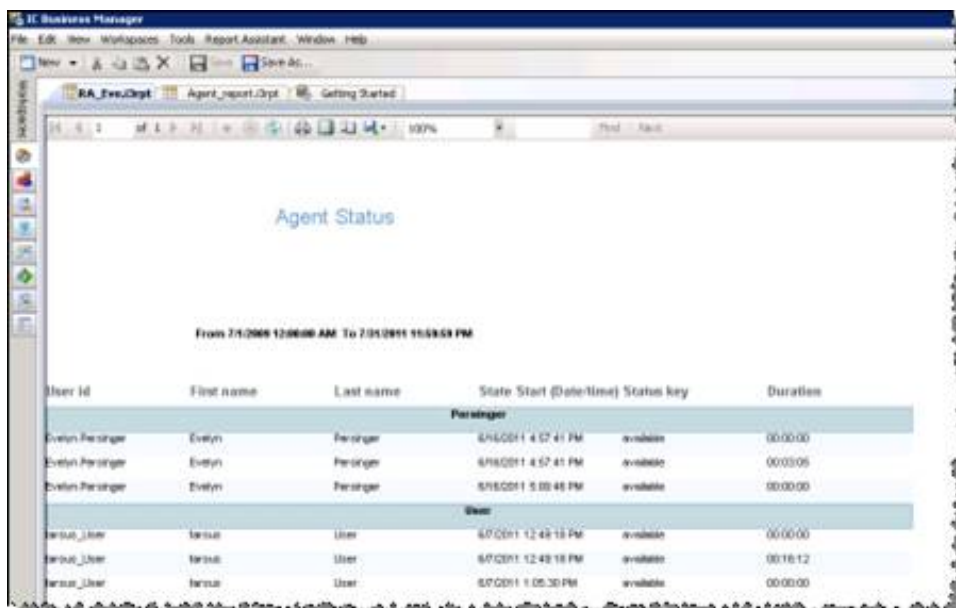
The Print Layout icon is on the toolbar at the top of the Report Viewer window.



The **Print Layout** icon is a toggle command that allows you to switch between viewing the report in print layout and the report session. When Print Layout is on, you are able to visualize how the report will print. Print your report when Print Layout is on.



If Print Layout is off, the normal view of the report session is displayed in the Workspace.



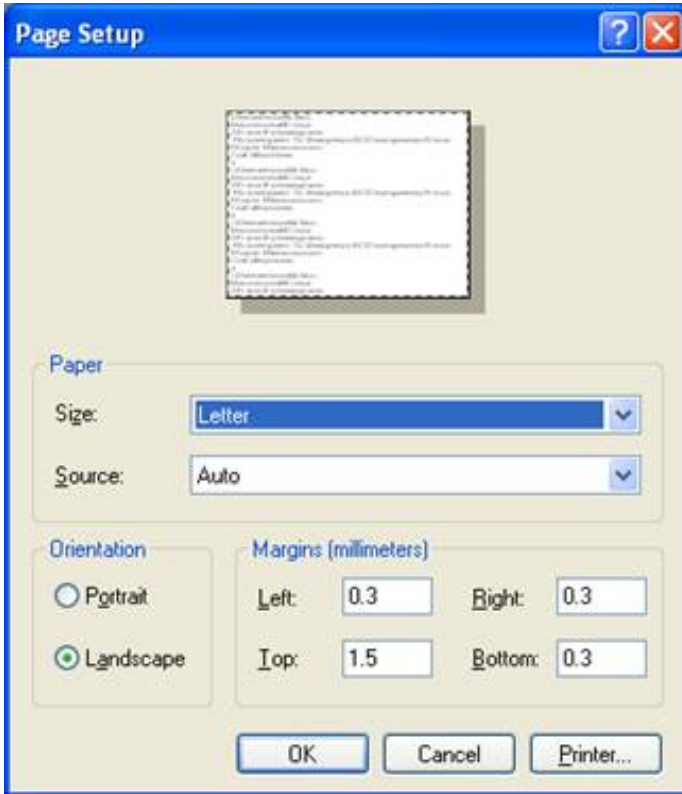
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## Page Setup

The Page Setup icon is on the toolbar at the top of the Report Viewer in the Workspace.



Page Setup allows you to set up your report for printing purposes.



Page dimensions are initialized by the application during the generation of the report. Use the **Page Setup** dialog to override these dimensions, for printing purposes. If you Export the report, the dimensions that were initially generated by the application are used, *not* the dimensions specified in the **Page Setup** dialog.

## Saving report query selections

You can save your customized report selections as an **Interaction Report Assistant File (\*.irpt)** to use again. Report selections that have not been saved display an asterisk (\*) on the **Report Tab**. To save your report selections:

1. On the menu bar, click **Report Assistant**
2. On the **Report Assistant** menu, click **Save**, or **Save As**
3. On the dialog name your file, and click **Save**.

# Open Interaction Report Assistant File



Saved Interaction Report Assistant files can be opened using **Open Interaction Report Assistant File**.

Use **Open Interaction Report Assistant File** to view and edit saved report query selections and to generate a report from a saved query.

## Open a saved report file

Use the **Open Interaction Report Assistant File** dialog to open an Interaction Report Assistant File. To access the **Open Interaction Report Assistant File** dialog:

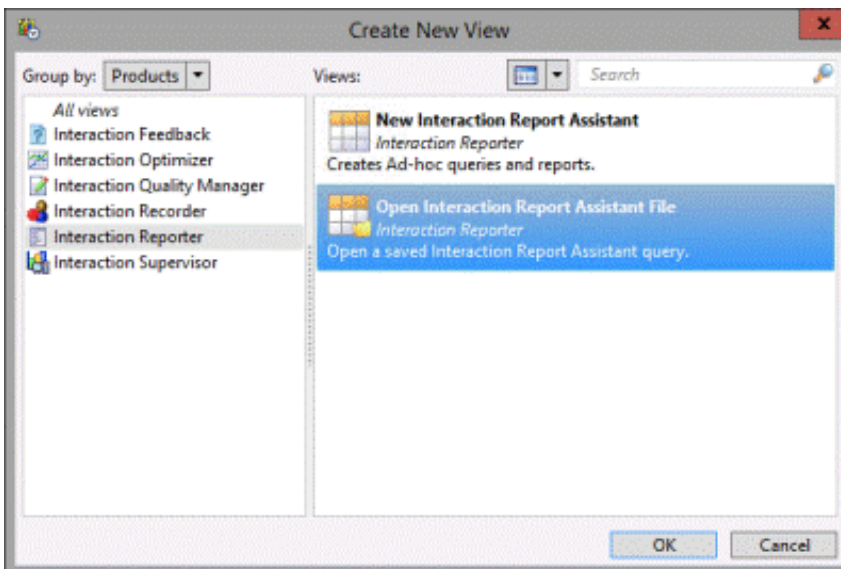
1. In IC Business Manager, click the Default Workspace module button.



2. On the IC Business Manager toolbar, click **New**.



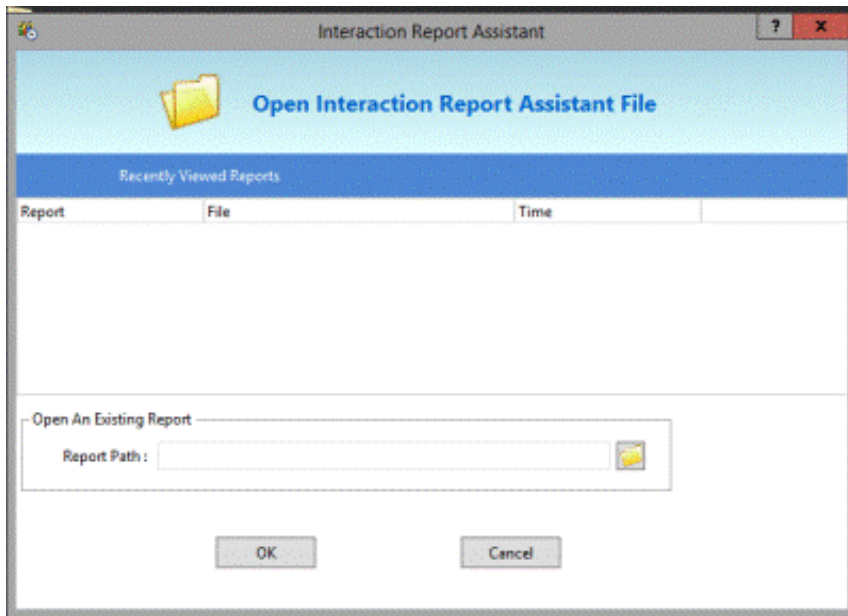
The **Create New View** dialog is displayed.



3. In the **Group by** drop-down, select **Products**, and in the left pane select **Interaction Reporter**.
4. In the right pane, select **Open Interaction Report Assistant File**, and click **OK**.



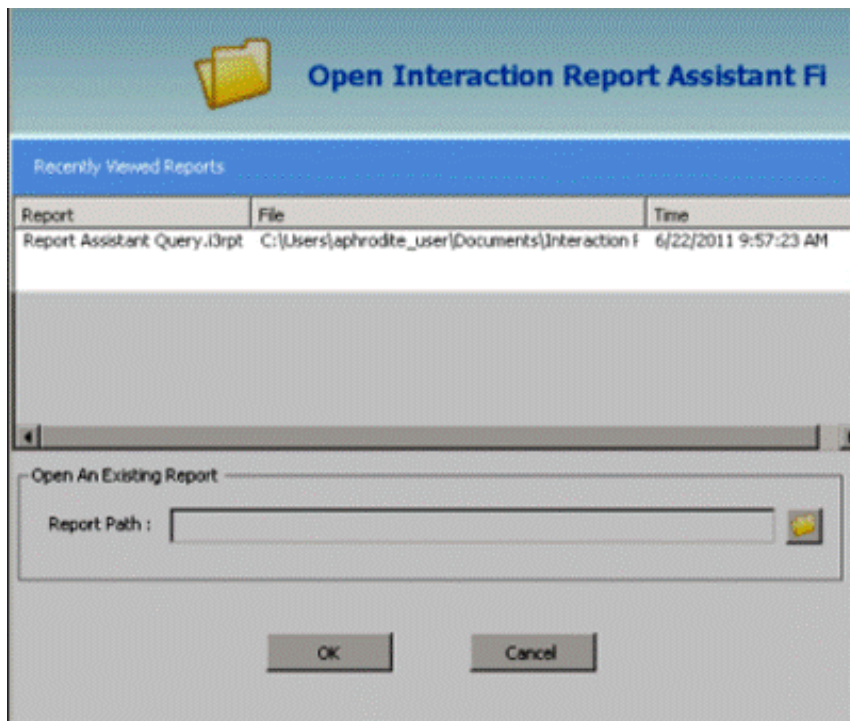
The Interaction Report Assistant Open Interaction Report Assistant File dialog is displayed.



Use this dialog to open Recently Viewed Reports or Open An Existing Report from a saved Interaction Report Assistant file.

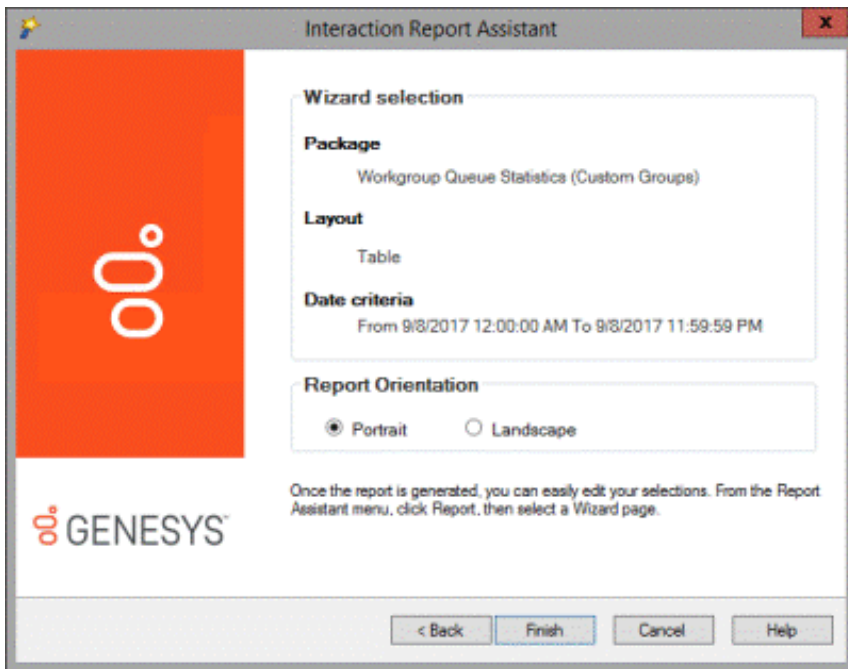
## Opening a Recently Viewed Report

To open a recently viewed and saved report, in the Open Interaction Report Assistant File dialog, under Recently Viewed Reports, select a saved report file, and click OK.



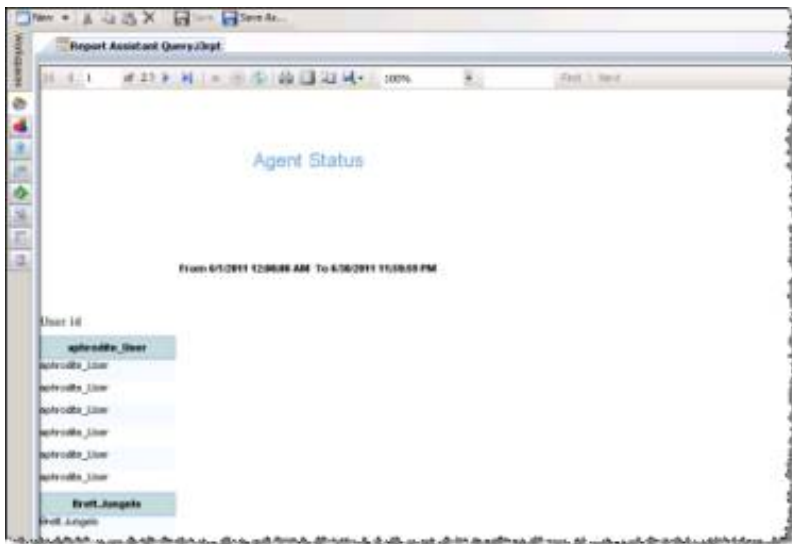
The Interaction Report Assistant query is displayed.





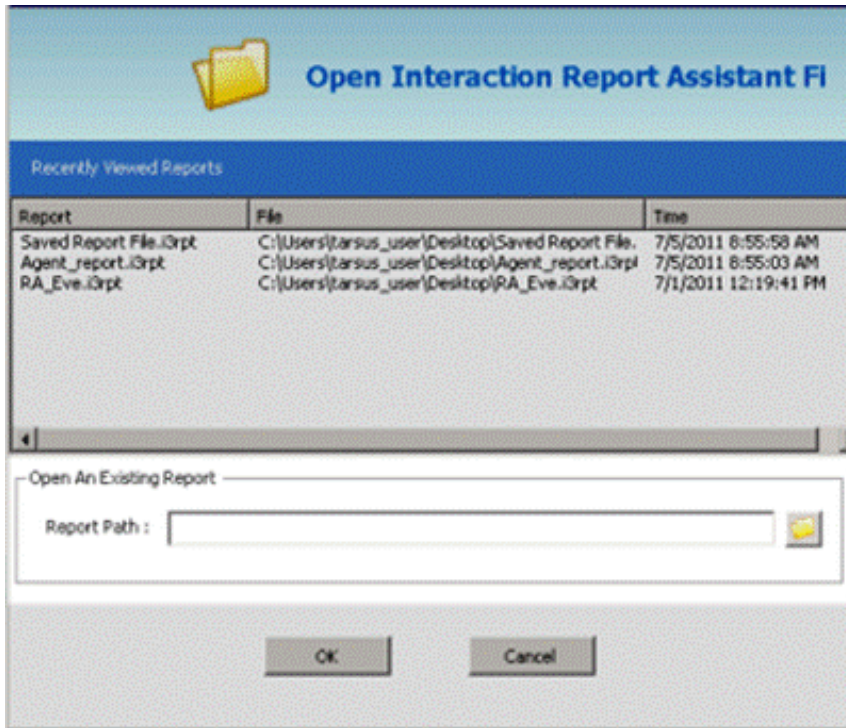
To generate and view the report, click **Finish**.

The report is displayed in the Workspace.

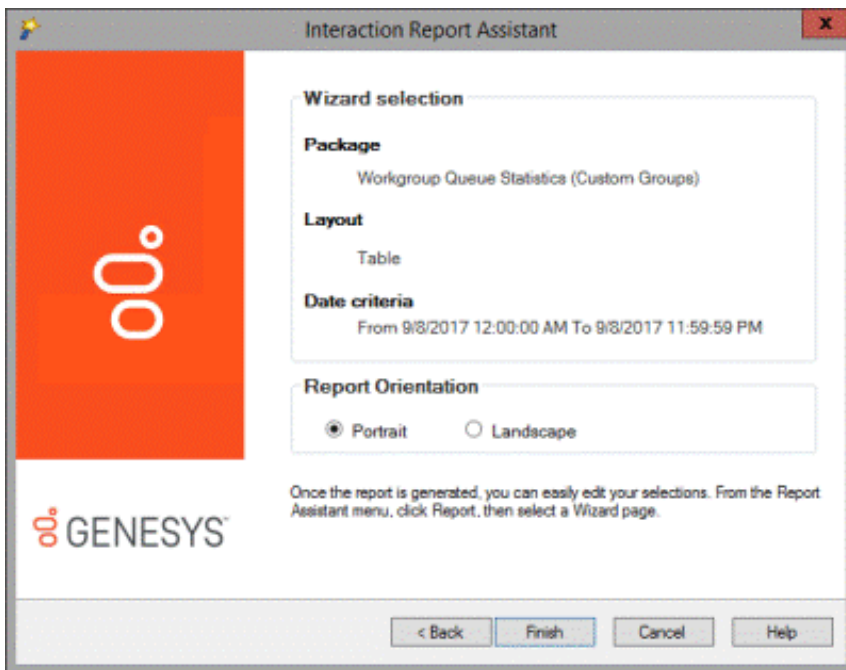


## Open a Saved Report Query

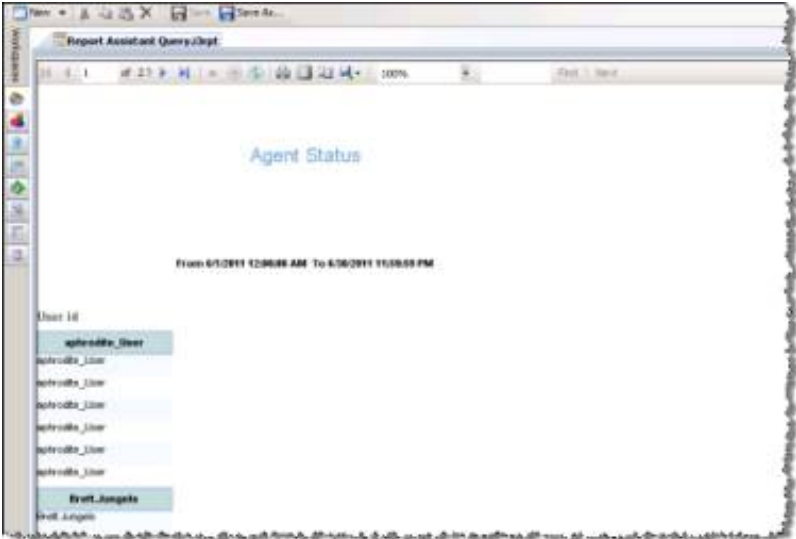
To open a saved report file and view the report, in the **Open Interaction Report Assistant File** dialog, under **Open an Existing Report**, use the browse button to select a **Report Path**, and click **OK**.



The Interaction Report Assistant query is displayed.



To generate and view the report, click **Finish**. The report is displayed in the Workspace.

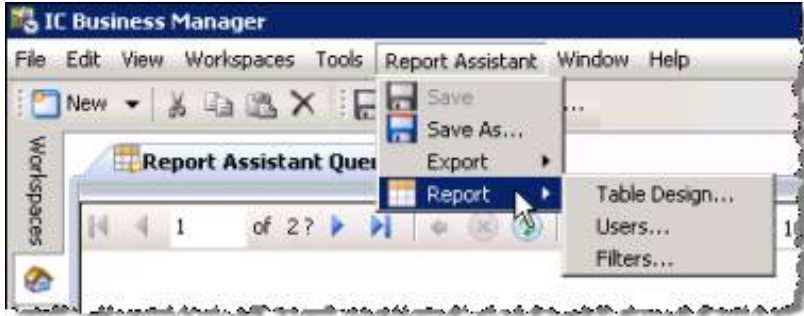


# Edit a report

You can edit a report when it is displayed in the Workspace.

## Edit a Report Query

When a report is displayed in the Workspace, you can edit the query using the **Report Assistant** menu. On the menu bar, click **Report Assistant**, point to **Report**, and on the submenu select which part of the query you want to edit. The options are: **Table Design**, **Users**, and **Filters**.



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### Table Design

Select **Table Design** to make changes to fields and columns that appear in the report. When you click **Table Design** on the Report Assistant menu, the wizard page appears with your previous selections. Make your new selections and press **Next** to continue.

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### Users

Select **Users** to make changes to the users on which to run the report. When you click **Users** on the Report Assistant menu, the wizard page appears with your previous selections. Make your new selections and press **Next** to continue.

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### Filters

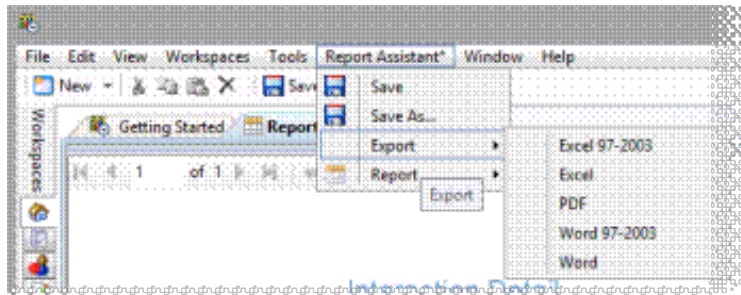
Select **Filters** to make changes to the filters that display the data in your report. When you click **Filters** on the Report Assistant menu, the wizard page appears with your previous selections. Make your new selections and press **Next** to continue.

# Distributing a report

You can save a report to an Excel, PDF, or Word file for distribution.

## Saving a report to a file for distribution

To save the report, on the menu bar, click **Report Assistant**, point to **Export**, and on the submenu select which format to export the report to. The export options are: Excel, PDF, and Word.



# Appendix A

## Package report fields

The following charts contain descriptions of Interaction Report Assistant report fields and database table information. Each chart includes the *Friendly name* used in Interaction Assistant Reports and the actual Field name from the database table. Currently there are 9 to 12 packages to choose from when creating your special purpose reports. The availability of packages depends on the installed products, for example Tracker or Recorder.

## 1. Agent Status

The Agent Status package contains the records of agent state changes based on login and logouts, status, and ACD login and logouts.

The records for this package are stored in the **AgentActivityLog** database table.

User id	UserID	User or Agent ID
State Start (Date/time)	StatusDateTime	The date/time the agent started this current state which combine StatusKey, LoggedIn, AcdLoggedIn, StatusDND, or StatusACW
State Start GMT	StatusDateTimeGMT	The date/time of the start of the state displayed in local time
State Start (Date)	(Computed expression)	Only the Date of the start of the state
State Start (Time)	(Computed expression)	Only the time of the start of the state
Status key	StatusKey	Status key associated with the current state
Status Group	StatusGroup	Status group of the Status key: Available, Break, Followup, Training, Unavailable or your custom status group
Logged In (Flag)	LoggedIn	Flag indicating the the agent was logged in to CIC for the current state 1=True
Logged In (Description)	(Computed expression)	Describes if the user is logged in to CIC for the current state
Status Dnd	StatusDnd	Flag indicating that the StatusKey of this state was a Do Not Disturb status 1=True
Status Acw	StatusAcw	Flag indicating that the StatusKey of this state was an After Call Work status 1=True
Duration	StateDuration	Duration of the state
State end date/time	EndDateTime	The end date/time of this state
State end date/time GMT	EndDateTimeGMT	The end date/time of this state displayed in local date/time
Sequencing number	SeqNo	Sequencing number to preserve the state order when state changes occurred in the same second
First name	FirstName	User or Agent first name
Last name	LastName	User or Agent last name
Site Id	Siteld	Site identifier

## 2. Agent and Queue Statistics

The Agent and Queue Statistics package contains the records of interval-based interaction statistics associated with the User Queue.

The records for this package come from the **IAgentQueueStats** view. Every row represents the statistics for the Agent Queue for the whole interval. There is no notion of media types, or skills in this package.

Agent Queue Statistics Report Fields		
Friendly name	Field name/Table	Description
User ID	cName	User or Agent ID
Queue	cReportGroup	User queues automatically have a report group for each distribution queue for which they are a member. This field can contain skills-based routing information or DNIS-based reporting if the DNIS reporting server parameter has been turned on.
Interval Begin (Date/Time)	dIntervalStart	Starting date/time of the interval. The interval is a server parameter value setup in IA. The default interval is 1800 seconds relative the hour.
Interval Begin Date	Computed expression	Starting Date of the interval. The interval is a server parameter value setup in IA. The default interval is 1800 seconds relative the hour.
Interval Begin Time	Computed expression	Starting Time of the interval. The interval is a server parameter value setup in IA. The default interval is 1800 seconds relative the hour.
Site ID	SiteId	Site identifier of the source for this record. Used in multi-site installations to distinguish the origin of the record. Configured when setting up CIC.
Interval duration	nDuration	The duration of the interval. If dIntervalStart is an odd start time, the duration of the interval will have a non-standard length.
Number ACD Entries	nEnteredACD	The number of ACD related queue interactions that entered this queue during the interval.
Number Abandoned ACD	nAbandonedACD	The number of ACD related queue interactions that abandoned—an answered call that is disconnected before any conversation happens— this queue during the interval.
Number Alerted ACD	nAlertedAcid	Number of ACD related queue interactions that were in an Alerting state while in this queue. Note that interactions which transition to Alerting more than once are only counted once.
Number Answered ACD	nAnsweredAcid	Number of ACD related queue interactions that were answered by the agent. Answered interactions are interactions that reached a Client_Connected state with an agent.
Number Answered	nAnswered	Number of all interactions—ACD and non-ACD—that were answered by the user. Answered interactions are interactions that reached a Client_Connected state with an agent.
Time ACW	tAcw	Time the user spent in an After Call Work
Number ACW Interactions	nAcwCalls	Number of outbound interactions made by the user during ACW
Time on ACW Outbound	tAcwCalls	Time the user spent on outbound interactions during After Call Work time
Number Transferred ACD	nTransferredAcid	Number of ACD interactions transferred while on this queue
Number not Answered ACD	nNotAnsweredAcid	Number of ACD interactions that were not answered when presented to the agent as an Alerting interaction. The nNotAnsweredAcid interactions will also count towards nFlowOutAcid.
Time Alerted ACD	tAlertedAcid	Time ACD interactions spent in an Alerting state on this user queue



Number Flow outs	nFlowOutAcid	Number of ACD interactions that flowed out during this interval. Flow outs are defined as queue interactions that were removed from a queue without reaching an inactive state.
Time Flow Outs	tFlowOutAcid	Time ACD interactions were in queue before being counted in nFlowOutAcid.
Number Disconnected ACD	nDisconnectAcid	Number of ACD interactions that disconnected while still on the queue. A flow out would not be counted.
Time User Logged In	tAgentLoggedIn	Time the user was logged in to the client
Time User Available	tAgentAvailable	Time the user was in an available status, whether or not the agent is activated
Time User Talk	tAgentTalk	Sum of time in seconds the agent was on interactions (ACD and non-ACD) from first Client_Connected until end of ACW for this queue.
Time User Other Busy	tAgentOtherBusy	Time the user was working on interactions (ACD and non-ACD) for queues other this one
Time User ACD Call	tAgentOnAcidCall	Time the user was working on ACD interactions for this queue only
Time User Other ACD Call	tAgentOnOtherAcidCall	Time the user was working on ACD interactions for other queues
Time User ACW	tAgentInAcw	Time the user was in an After Call Work state
Time User Non ACD	tAgentOnNonAcidCall	Time the user was in an After Call Work state
Time User DND	tAgentDnd	Time the user was in a DND state. It is driven by the combination of ACD availability and client status

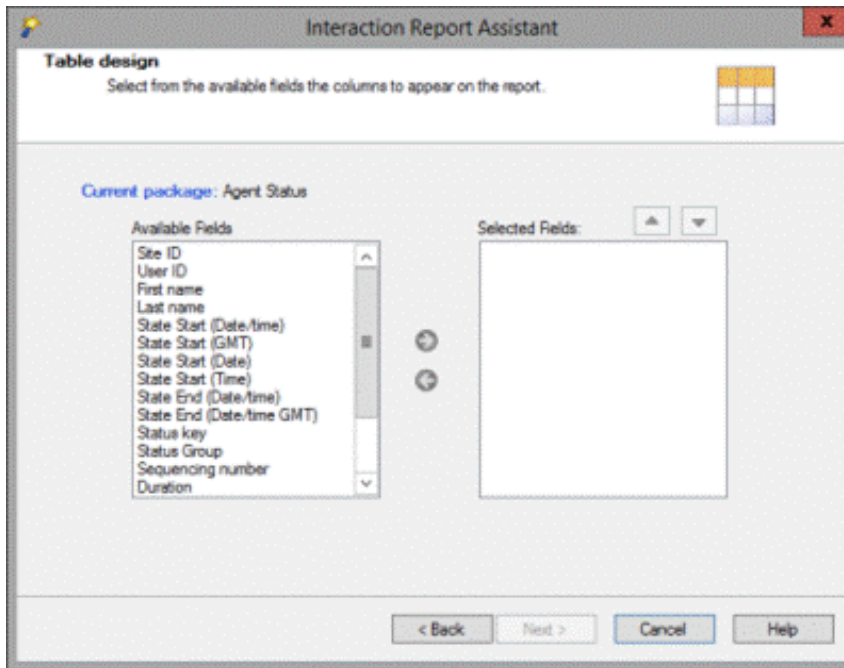
## Tips for using Interaction Report Assistant

Here are a few time-saving suggestions on creating special purpose reports with Interaction Report Assistant.

### Tip 1 Choose a data package closest to your reporting environment

For the best reporting results, choose an available data package that is closest to the reporting results you're looking for. Here are two cases.

- If your environment has Media Type turned off, choose the data package Workgroup Queue Statistics.
- Also if your environment has Media Type turned on, and you require Interaction Type for your reports, choose the data package Workgroup Queue Statistics (Media Type).

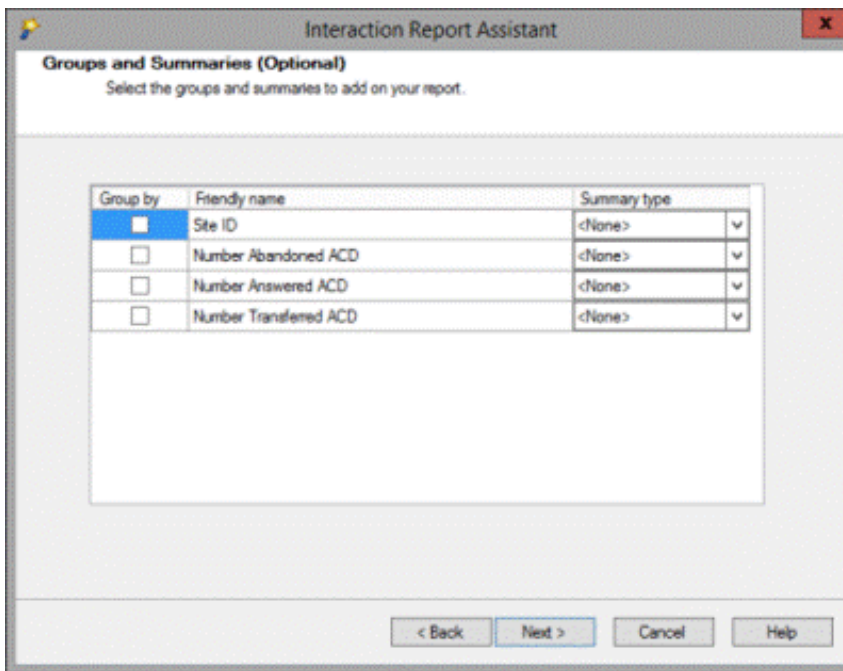


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## Tip 2 Use Groups and Summaries to display your results

When designing a report using Interaction Type fields, use Groups and Summaries to display your statistics in your report. Here's an example.

- After specifying your Workgroups and a Date/Time filter for your report, group by Queue and Interaction Type, and add summaries to the statistics you want to display in your report.



### Sample reports

Your report will display the totals for the different types of interactions in each queue.

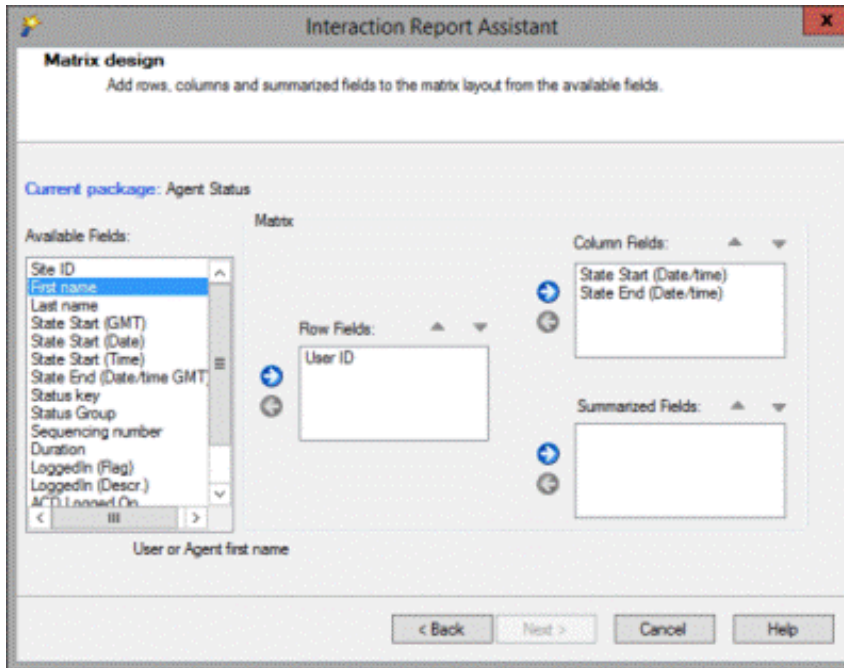

### Tip 3 Choose a Matrix layout to display reporting results

Choosing a Matrix layout for your report allows you to display and compare data in rows, columns, and summarized fields. For example, the same summary data in the previous sample reports can be displayed using the Matrix layout. The Matrix layout automatically hides the detail rows. Here's how to set up a Matrix design.

- Specify the Interaction Type in the Row fields, the Queue in the Column fields, and summarize the Number ACD Entries and Number Answered ACD fields.



### Sample report

Your Matrix report will look like this. Note that the matrix shows only the summaries and not the detail rows.

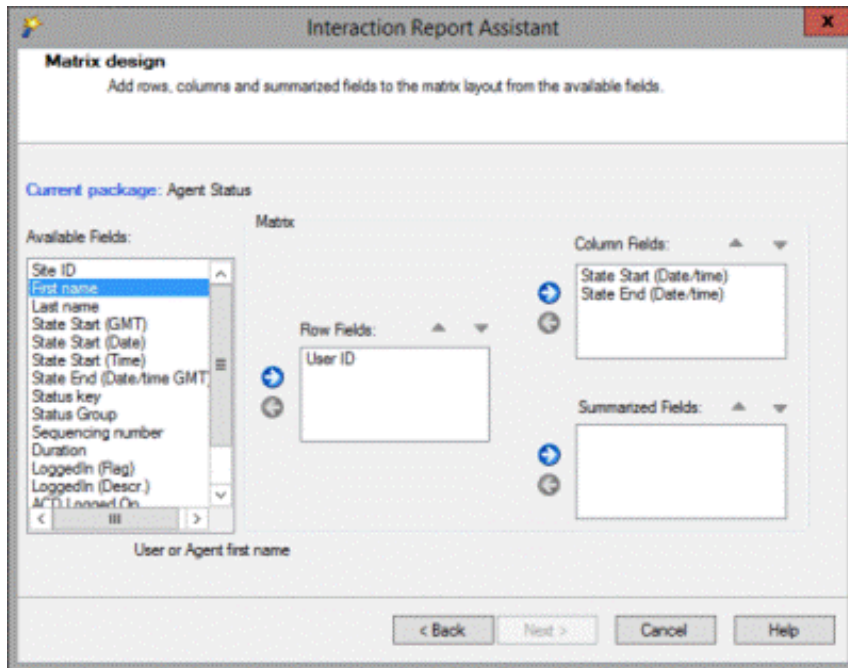

## Tip 4 Simply change a report with Row and Column fields

You can quickly change the presentation of your reports by changing the fields that appear in your rows and columns, without affecting the reporting results. For example, changing the Queue and Interaction Type fields you can quickly change the way your data is displayed in a report.

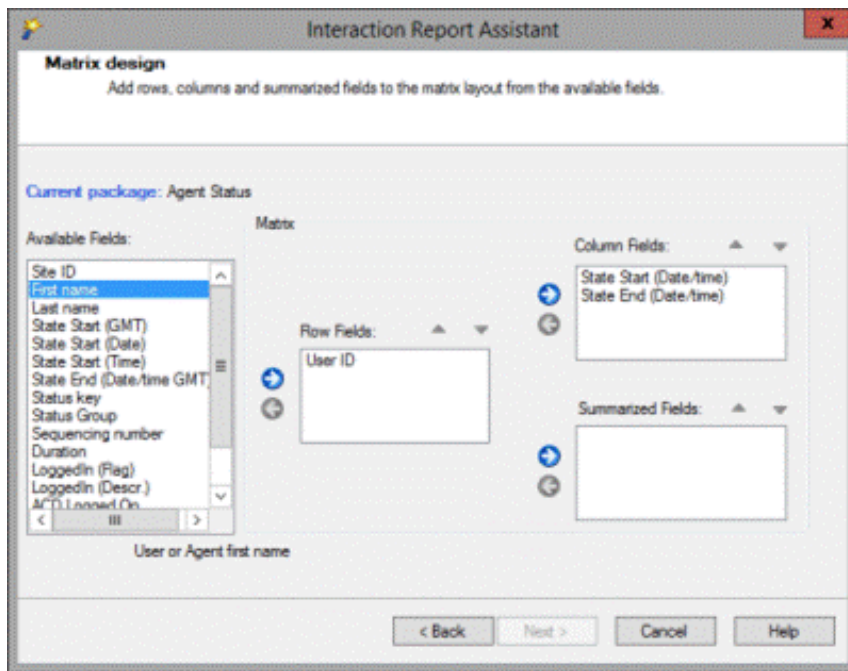
Your Matrix report displays the same information in a different layout.

## Tip 5 Add a Time field when reporting statistics by intervals

When reporting on statistics by intervals, add a Time field, such as Interval Begin Time, to make your report more meaningful. Here's an example of adding a Row with the Begin Time.

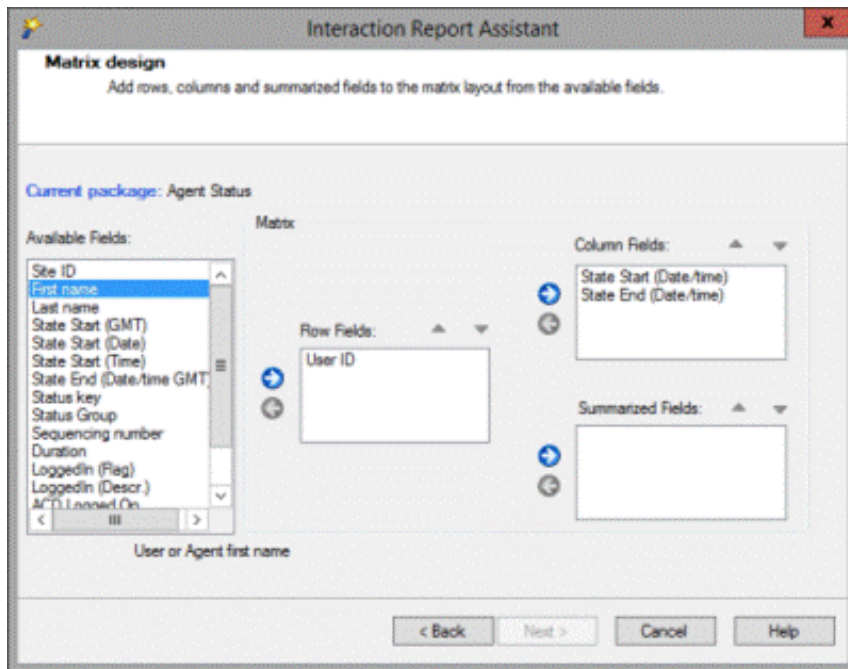

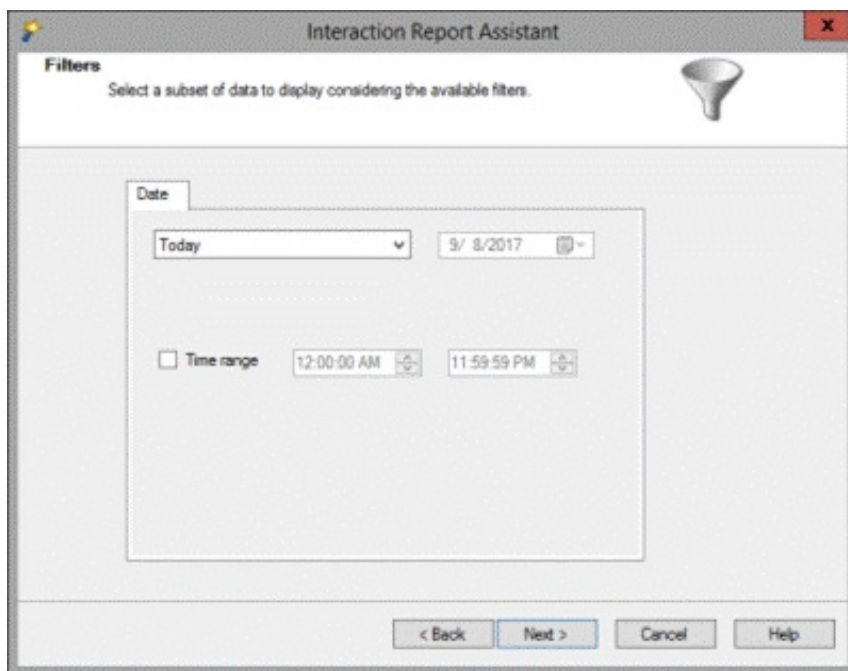
## Tip 6 Add a Date field in a report column to display day-to-day statistics

When reporting on day-to-day statistics, add an Interval Begin Date to the column field of your report to display daily statistics for a Workgroup.



## Use a Date and Time filter to limit your query

Using a Date and Time filter narrows the range of data displayed in your report. Select a limited Date range, as this query brings all rows found for all queues.

The following report shows the results when using an Interval Begin Date in the column field and filtering by Date.

## Tip 7 Use Excel for additional data edits

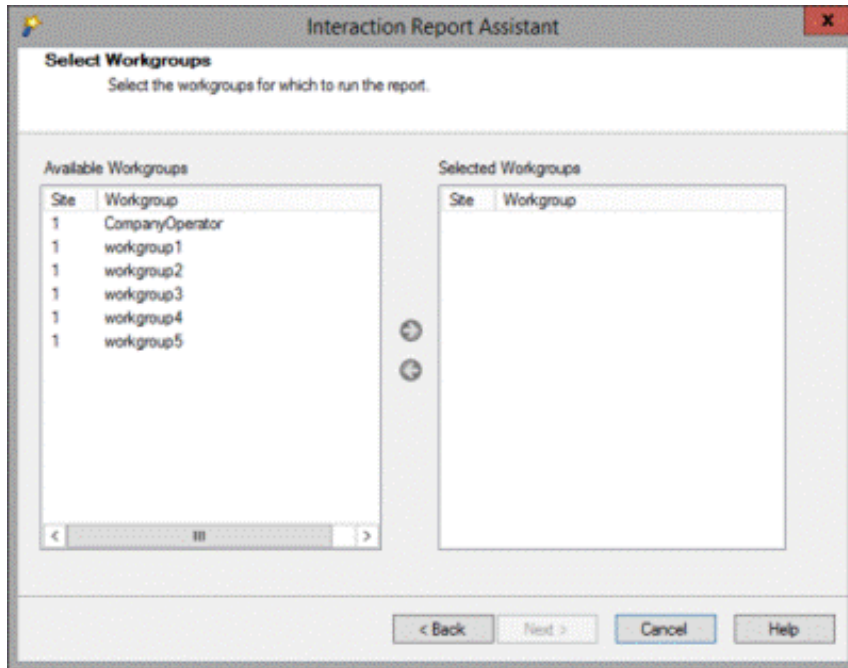
You can generate a report with all available data and continue editing the data in Excel. Simply export your report to Excel and create additional groups, filter summaries, and calculations to display your reporting data.



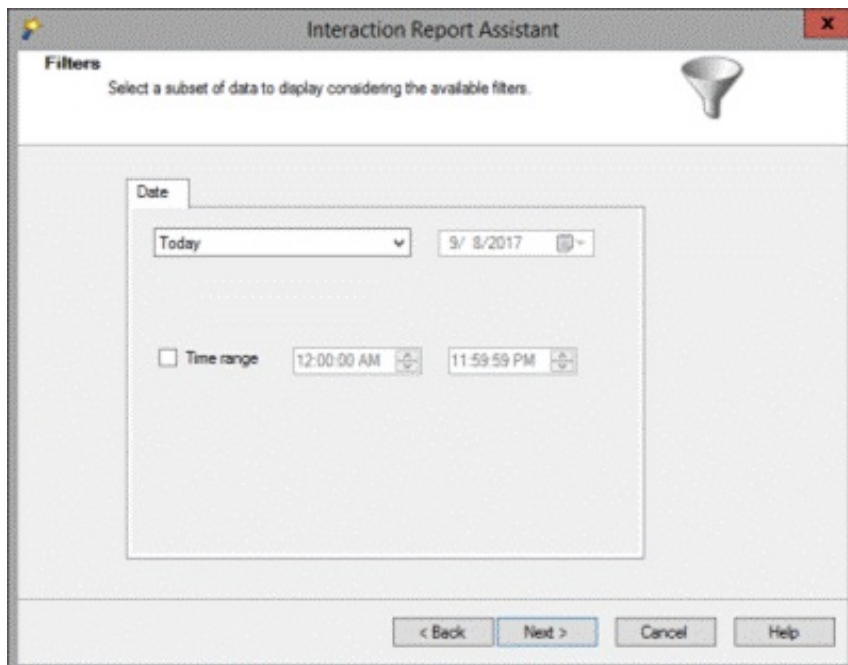
## Tip 8 Get additional data for Workgroups

You can get additional data for Workgroups that do not currently appear in the Available Workgroups list.

If you need to report on statistics for a Workgroup that does not appear in the Available Workgroups list, leave the Selected Workgroups list box empty, and continue to the Date/Time filter.



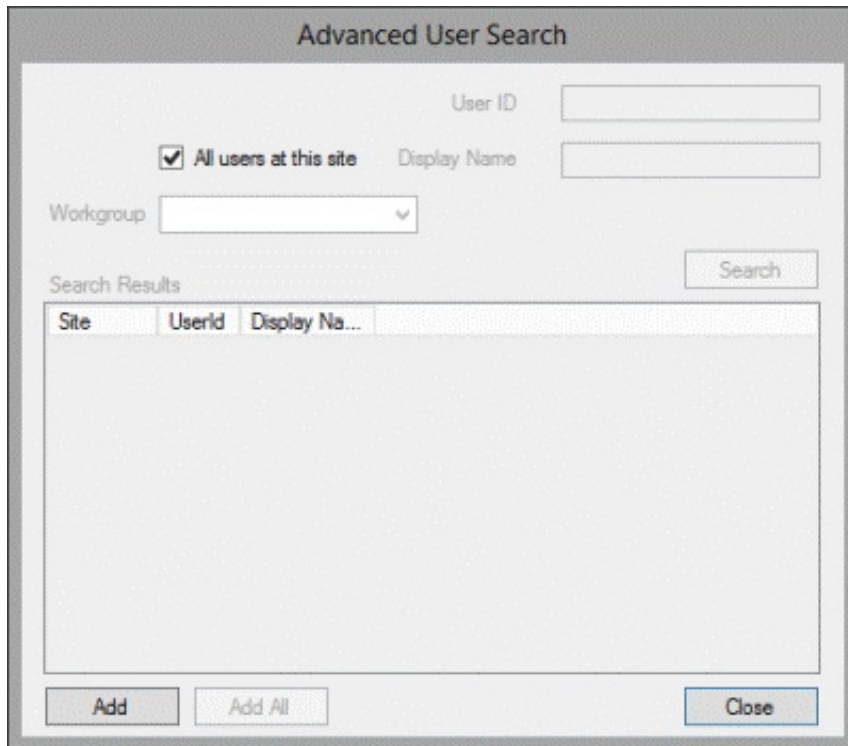
Because this query brings all rows found for all workgroups on the date specified, select a short Date/Time range when the Workgroup was active.



When you have all the data in the report, you can export your report to Excel and apply filters to get the statistics of the workgroup you are most interested in.

## Tip 9 Speeding up queries

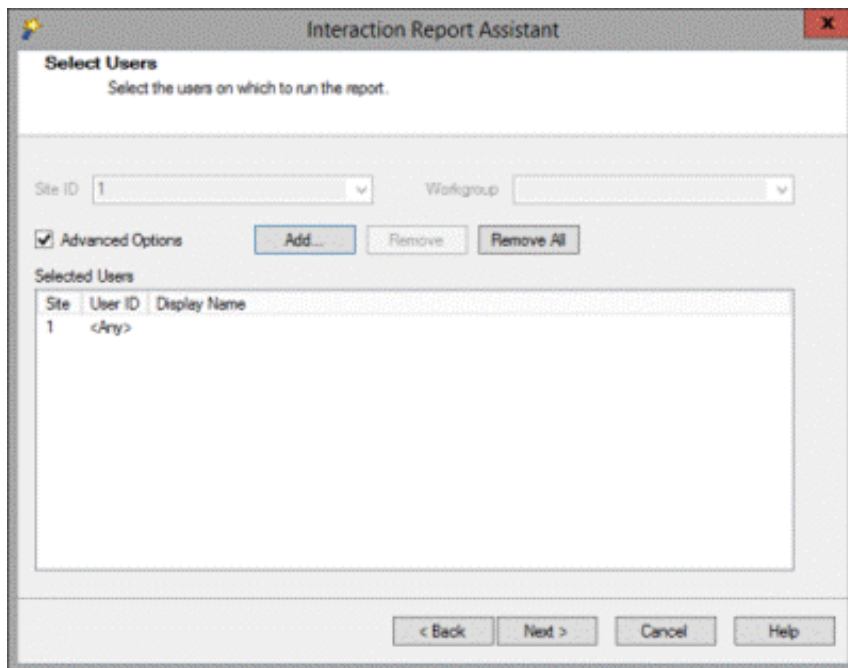
Selecting a long list of Users might affect query performance. To shorten query time running reports on Users, use the Advanced User Search dialog. This dialog allows you to select the box **All users at this site**, from the site selected in the previous **Select Users** dialog.



The Advanced User Search dialog box contains the following elements:

- User ID**: Text input field.
- Display Name**: Text input field.
- All users at this site**: Checkmark and label.
- Workgroup**: Dropdown menu.
- Search**: Button.
- Search Results**: Table with columns: Site, Userid, Display Na...
- Add**, **Add All**, and **Close**: Buttons at the bottom.

When you select a site, only one row is added to the report query, rather than creating a long list of users which might affect query performance.



The Interaction Report Assistant - Select Users dialog box contains the following elements:

- Select Users**: Title and instruction: "Select the users on which to run the report."
- Site ID**: Dropdown menu (value: 1).
- Workgroup**: Dropdown menu.
- Advanced Options**: Checkmark and label.
- Add...**, **Remove**, and **Remove All**: Buttons.
- Selected Users**: Table with columns: Site, User ID, Display Name.
- < Back**, **Next >**, **Cancel**, and **Help**: Buttons at the bottom.

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## Tip 10 Choosing fields for report columns

For Matrix reports, chose friendly names for the column fields that have a small number of finite values. Each value is placed in a separate column. For convenience, select a friendly name that has ten or fewer values. For a more intuitive report layout for friendly names that have more than ten values, place them in rows.
